What else can I do to support my child's learning?

- Research: Help my child find out about things by talking to people, asking questions, looking at books, magazines, newspapers, TV programmes or information books.
- School Website: encourage your child to visit the local library (The Hive) and our school website: www.st-barnabas-primary.worcs.sch.uk

Our website has a wide range of links and resources which can be found on the Maths and English pages and accessed from home.



- Reading: for pleasure and for information.
- Maths: increasing confidence in numbers, helping with the shopping, working out how much things will cost and asking how you would work it out. Telling the time.
- Writing: to increase confidence in writing letters, shopping lists, poems, fact files or stories.
- Sport: attending sporting activities and clubs.
- Music: practising favourite songs, playing an instrument, listening to music, attending religious services.
- Discussion: talk about different things with your child (practising their communication skills)
- Art: artistic hobbies such as drawing and painting.

- Develop the skills, confidence and motivation to study on their own.
- Involve Parents/Carers in their child's education.
- Encourage children to be creative.

Reception

Learn all letter sounds to support phonics and RWI.

Read a book every day to an adult.

Practise reading and spelling key vocabulary.

Practise counting forwards and backwards.

Year 1 and 2

Read a book every day to an adult.

Learn all letter sounds to support phonics and RWI.

Year 2 - Practise spellings rules and write sentences- Homework set on SeeSaw

Half termly Maths Missions- set on SeeSaw

Learn key number facts, such as addition and subtraction facts and multiplication facts.

Counting in 2s and 10s (Year 1)

Counting in 2s, 5s and 10s (Year 2)

Read their book every day and respond in reading diaries or complete MyBookBlog activities where appropriate.

Learn spelling rules – tested at school each week.

Complete a Learning Log once in each half term.

Complete 'Maths Missions' each week. Activities to reinforce the key learning in maths.
