

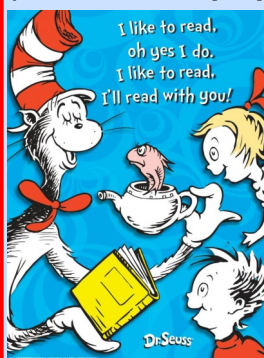


Reading Corner

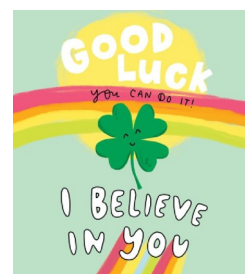

School Trips and Visits:

Children benefit enormously from school trips and visits. We **always subsidise** class trips out of the school budget but rely on parent support with transport and sometimes towards the cost of entry.

We want to give **every St. Barnabas child** the **best opportunities**.

We are looking at ways to **keep costs down** as we know that **all families** are facing **cost of living rises** and extra payments for energy. We will make every effort to give parents **as much notice as possible** when planning trips and support families who are experiencing **financial hardship**.

We don't want to stop running trips as children get so much out of them.

Before we confirm any bookings we will **check** that enough families are prepared to pay for their child to attend. If the trip goes ahead, no child would be discriminated against or excluded on the basis of not being able to pay however, if insufficient parents are able to support a trip we would not be able to go ahead.
