




By the end of this half term, children should know the following facts. The aim is for them to recall these facts with **speed and accuracy:**

Practical resources and ideas

Everyday Objects - Using items around the house to find different ways of making 10, e.g one blue teddy and nine red teddies. One and nine make ten.

Stories - Making up stories with items around the home, e.g there are 2 cars in the car park and 8 more cars arrive, how many cars altogether? Two and eight make ten

Use your fingers: to recall different ways to make 10. Look at how many fingers you have up and how many you have down e,g, 4 up and 6 down four and six makes ten
