










Children's Development and Learning:



- Green Lane Pre-School Curriculum follows the principles of the Early Years Foundation Stage Statutory Framework (EYFS 2024).
- The framework divides children's learning and development into seven areas.
- These are separated into **Prime** areas and **Specific** areas of learning. At Green Lane Pre-School we focus on the Prime areas first and use these as a starting point for our areas of development for your child.
- Green Lane Pre-School follows Development Matters as guidance.



Prime and Specific Areas in More Detail



Personal, Social and Emotional Development



Children's **personal, social and emotional development** (PSED) is crucial for your child to lead a **healthy** and **happy life**, and is fundamental to their **cognitive development**.

At **Green Lane Pre-School** we support and develop this through learning to:

Make strong, warm and supportive relationships with adults at pre-school

Make **secure attachments** and bonds with other people

Start to recognize and manage their **emotions**

Engage in **exciting opportunities** that will help your child become more **curious** and **self-confident** in their own **abilities**

Develop a positive sense of self

Set themselves simple goals

Persist when something is tricky

Wait for what they want and for direct attention when that's needed

Look after their bodies, including through **healthy eating and** tooth care

Manage their personal needs with more independence

Make good friendships

Co-operate with others and **resolve conflicts** peaceably.



Communication and Language

The development of your child's ability to communicate and their spoken language underpins all seven areas of learning and development.

At **Green Lane Pre-School** we support and develop this through:

Forming secure and trusted relationships

Creating a language rich environment with activities and resources that will excite and inspire your child's curiosity

High quality conversation and turn-taking

Comment on what your child is interested in or doing

Echoing back what they say with new vocabulary added

Reading frequently to your child individually, in small groups or as a whole pre-school group

Choosing and providing exciting, diverse and engaging books including stories, picture books, non-fiction, rhymes and poems

Helping your child to hear, use and learn new words every day


Story telling, language games and role play

Sensitive questioning that encourages your child to say more and feel understood

Physical Development

Physical activity is vital for your child's all-round development, developing healthy bodies and living happy, active live.

At **Green Lane Pre-School** we support and develop this through providing:

Sensory play and explorations

Opportunities to develop their core strength, co-ordination, stability, balance, agility and awareness of their own body

Gross motor play such as bikes, climbing, building and nature play

Opportunities to come to school to use the hall, climbing frames, equipment and large outside space with our qualified sports coaches in the terms before your child is due to start school.

Fine motor play such as play dough, painting, cutting, small world toys, arts and crafts

Mark-making such as using crayons, pencils, pens, paintbrushes, sponges, sand, mud, sticks, rice or gel-pads.


Activities which improve hand-eye co-ordination such as using small tools and construction toys.

Spatial awareness play such as using the parachute games, obstacle course, building and block play and puzzles.

Feedback and support which will develop your child's curiosity, concentration and vocabulary alongside their physical development.




Gain control over the small movements they can make with their arms, wrists and hands











Literacy

It is crucial for children to develop a life-long love of reading.

At **Green Lane Pre-School** we support and develop this through providing:

Both dimensions of **becoming a reader- language comprehension** and **word-reading.**

Adults to **talk with your child** about the **world around them** and the **books they read with them**.

Adults to share **rhymes**, **poems**, **stories**, **songs** and **non- fiction together** and encourage your child to be **curious** and **interested**. This will further develop your child's language
comprehension that they start learning at birth.

Early word reading and sound identification opportunities, all play based, where your child will start to hear and identify sounds in words and take part in oral blending and rhyming, when they are developmentally ready. We use the Read, Write, Inc. Early Years approach.

Early mark-making opportunities where your child will be encouraged to **say their ideas out loud** and comment on the world around them, before being taught any formal writing skills.



Mathematics

Developing a strong grounding in **number** is essential so that all children develop the necessary **building blocks** to excel mathematically.

At **Green Lane Pre-School** we support and develop this through providing:


Daily opportunities to count confidently and develop a deep understanding of the numbers to 10, the relationships between them and the patterns within those numbers.

Encouragement to **build and apply** this understanding - such as using small toys, natural materials or beads and tens frames or pots for **organising counting.**

Exposure to the **vocabulary** of **counting and understanding number**. Encouragement to 'have a **go**' and build their **interest and confidence** and to **spot patterns and connections**.

Toys, resources, activities and opportunities to develop spatial reasoning and early measuring and comparing.

A **safe**, **exciting** and **enjoyable** early experience of mathematics so your child is encouraged to develop a **positive** attitude.



Understanding the World

Understanding the world involves guiding children to make sense of their physical world and their community.

At **Green Lane Pre-School** we support and develop this through providing:

Exciting daily opportunities to increase their **knowledge and understanding**, through **talk**, **play**, our **nature area** and **visits and visitors**.

Embracing and welcoming every child and their family and acknowledging their culture, heritage, language, faith and background.

Visitors to pre-school such as people who help us like police officers, nurses and fire fighters or our local story teller.

Community visits such as to school, the allotment, church, the shop or the care home.

A wide and diverse range of **non-fiction books**, **video clips**, **stories**, **songs**, **pictures**, **artefacts**, **rhymes and poems** that will foster their curiosity and understanding of their local community and the wider world that they live in.

Exposure to **new words** to **widen their vocabulary, knowledge and understanding** and later on, their **reading comprehension**.

Expressive Arts and Design Development

The development of children's **artistic and cultural awareness** supports their **imagination and creativity.**

At **Green Lane Pre-School** we support and develop this through providing:

Daily opportunities to explore and play with a wide range of art materials and different art media. This might include, pencils, crayons, pastels, paints, collage, cutting and sticking, weaving and joining materials. It might include natural art materials too such as leaves, grass, pebbles, twigs or mud.

Encouragement to express themselves and their own ideas and observations through the arts, learning new vocabulary and sharing their ideas, opinions and feelings.

Opportunities to **return again and again** to **favourite** art activities and to **try new ones**.

Daily opportunities to sing, dance, listen to music and participate in role play, stories, songs, rhymes and creative activities.



Explore, using their senses, a variety of materials and media



Become interested in the way that music, dance, words, stories and role-play can be used to express ideas and feelings





Green Lane Nature Area

Our Nature Area allows children to play, explore and discover their natural environment and have fun through first - hand experiences.

At **Green Lane Pre-School** we support and develop this through providing:

Activities such as **building dens**, creating in the **mud kitchen**, searching for **mini beasts and plants**, **digging**, **planting** and **climbing**.

Daily outdoor opportunities to develop self-confidence, independence and curiosity while improving their physical coordination and fine and gross motor skills.

Social skills through working together, helping children to create bonds and build friendships.

Opportunities to care for one another and the plants and animals they see.

Connection to nature, a love of the environment and a respect for our natural world.

Children with SEND have an enhanced transition based on their particular needs. Green Lane educators meet with the teachers at their next school, so they have a clear picture of how best to manage their needs.
