Reading

During reading activities, the children will be focusing on:

- The Boy Who Grew Dragons: activities linked to class text
- Non- fiction books linked to the Vikings
- Vipers Comprehension skills: Vocabulary, Inference, Prediction, Explain, Retrieval and Summarise
- Daily reading for enjoyment, promoting fluency and good 'book talk'

Writing

Writing will be based on The Egg and Dare to Care for a Pet Dragon. The children will be:

- Writing a formal letter about the discovery of a Dragon Egg
- Planning and writing a television report describing the hatching of a dragon egg
- Writing and editing a non-chronological report on caring for a pet dragon
- Writing an account about life as a Viking in the first person

Maths

This term our key areas of learning will be focusing on:

- Multiplying 2-digit numbers by 1-digit number
- Multiplying 3-digit numbers by 1-digit number
- Dividing 2-digit numbers by 1-digit number
- Dividing 3-digit numbers by 1-digit number
- Measuring in kilometres and meters
- Finding perimeter in a grid, of a rectangle and of rectilinear shapes
- Finding the perimeter of regular and non-regular polygons
