

Key Questions

The children will learn to...

- Inform our class with a small presentation about their favourite healthy snack or meal.
- Present ideas effectively.

Reading

Children will learn to:

- listen to stories talking about the characters, settings and key events.
- use new vocabulary.
- tell their own stories and act them out.
- talk about the features of non-fiction texts and poems.
- use their phonic knowledge to read and write simple sentences.

Writing

Children will learn to:

- use their phonics skills to sound out words and segment words to spell.
- carry out independent and focussed writing tasks.
- begin to write simple sentences on their own.
- write for different purposes.
- practise correct letter formation.

Maths

Children will learn to:

- build numbers beyond 10.
- notice 13 is 10 and 3, 14 is 10 and 4.
- verbally count to 20 and beyond.
- say 1 more and 1 less than a number.
- carry out subtracting.
- understand and discuss the composition of shapes.
- select, rotate and manipulate shapes.
- subitise (recognise amounts on sight).

Physical Development

Children will learn to:

- show good control and coordination in large and small movements.
- handle equipment and tools effectively, including pencils for writing.
- know the importance for good health, of physical exercise and a healthy diet, and talk about ways to keep healthy.

Children will learn to:

- know some similarities and differences between things in the past and now.
- know some similarities and differences between the natural world around them and contrasting environments.
- explore life cycles and features of a variety of living things, including butterflies.
- Computing programming a 'Codeapillar' to follow a trail.
