
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
The children will write a speech on the theme of 'We love Worcester.' They will prepare a speech in a clear and organised way. They will learn how to deliver a speech confidently to an audience.

Reading

The children will:

- Listen to, read and discuss a range of quality texts, such as 'Claude in the city and Zog
- Discuss the sequence of events
- Discuss favourite words and phrases
- Discuss story setting
- Answer and ask questions
- Predict what might happen based on what has been read
- Participate in discussions about what is real

Writing

The children will:

- Use high quality texts to inspire their writing
- Write a simple narrative
- Think of a sentence, saying a sentence out loud and writing that sentence down
- Apply RWI set 2 and 3 sounds in our writing
- Use capital letters and using full stops
- Remember to use finger spaces
- Write a character profile and use adjectives to describe a character's appearance and personality
- Write descriptive sentences

Maths

The children will:

- Count from 50-100
- Count in tens to 100
- Partition numbers into tens and ones
- Say 1 more and 1 less than a number up to 100
- Compare numbers with the same number of tens

Money:

- Compare any two numbers
- Recognise coins
- Recognise notes
