The children will write a speech on the theme of 'We love Worcester.'


They will prepare a speech in a clear and organised way. They will learn how to present a speech confidently to an audience.

- Further develop accurate and speedy word recognition by reading longer (multi-syllabic) words applying Read, Write, Inc set 2 & 3 sounds
- Read on sight and spell Year 2 common exception words and words with syllables
- Explore the meaning of new vocabulary

Writing

The children will:

- Write a short narrative with a beginning, middle and end
- Use paragraphs
- Use expanded noun phrases to describe a setting within a story
- Write a recount of our school trip
- Use a range of time openers
- Choose effective vocabulary
- Write a non-chronological report linked to our class text
- Use headings and subheadings
- Use technical vocabulary
