



Reading

Reading plays a vital part in our learning and understanding of the world. Over this half term, the children will be exposed to a wide range of texts. They will develop positive attitudes to reading, and an understanding of what they read by:

- Listening to and discussing a wide range of fiction, non-fiction, poetry and reference books
- Using dictionaries to check the meaning of words that they have read
- Participating in discussions about books that are read to them and those they can read for themselves
- Developing and using VIPERS comprehension skills

Writing

Our year 4 writers will have many and varied opportunities to write and be inspired by texts we look at in class. This half term, they will develop writerly skills by exploring sentence structure and vocabulary to move the narrative on.

Our writers will be producing a:

- Non-chronological report based on David Attenborough
- Persuasive speech to promote a positive change to our environment
- Persuasive letter to local supermarkets to persuade them to support sustainable farming of palm oil.
- Piece of poetry inspired by Kate Wakeling
