

Personal Social and Emotional Development.

The children will have opportunities to:

- develop relationships with peers, their key person, other adults in setting and develop friendships.
- talk about activities they enjoy and have ideas on how to extend their play in their own simple terms.
- do 'important' jobs in their role as Happy Helper.
- share and take turns and to use good manners.
- develop their understanding of routines and rules of kind hands, feet and words, good sitting, listening and looking.
- visit 'Big School' if they are going to school in September.
- Talk about their feelings.
- Learn about the importance of teeth cleaning and keeping fit and healthy.

Physical Development

The children will have opportunities to:

- move about the indoor and outdoor space in lots of different ways.
- use the trikes and scooters.
- mark make and explore with fine motor and gross motor tools and materials.
- use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils (pre-schoolers)
- Make snips in paper with scissors.
- help with clothing e.g. with hats, coats and shoes.
- take part in movement activities, Sticky Kids, physical play at 'Big School', moving to music and yoga.
- practise throwing, kicking, catching and aiming.
- develop their independence in health care and toileting.

Communication and Language.

The children will have lots of opportunities to:

- listen to and join in with familiar/new stories, songs and rhymes. Remembering what has happened.
- develop their ability to respond to simple instructions and understand and ask different questions.
- talk to each other and the adults in the setting and share their important 'news'.
- join in with small group work where they can listen and chat to their peers whilst engaging in an activity.
- practise using the correct tenses when speaking and encourage intonation.
- helping Fred our Frog to talk in words.
- learn new vocabulary linked to our topic.

Journeys



Reminders:

Ideas For Activities At Home

- talk about the seasons and what happens in the natural world.
- share lots of story books encouraging your child to tell you what might happen next, how the story might end or which parts of the story they like best and why.
- share rhyming stories and songs.
- recite numbers and count all different things. Look at numbers in the environment
- talk about their journeys and how we get from one place to another.
- talk about different countries and similarities and differences.

Maths

The children will have opportunities to:

- sort and match objects, such as colour, shape or
- explore numbers in the environment.
- recite numbers and count objects and actions.
- use number language such as 'more' and 'a lot' and think about numbers that are one more than.
- represent numbers in their mark making.
- talk about the language of size; big, small, long, short. Etc.
- recognise numbers and link numerals to amounts.
- notice patterns around them. Extend and create patterns.

Literacy

The children will have opportunities to:

- look at and share different books.
- join in with stories and say what might happen next or how the story might end. Talk about the characters and how they feel.
- recall stories in their own words using the pictures as a guide.
- name the different parts of a book and learn that print has meaning.
- give meanings to marks as they draw and paint.
- make marks on their picture to stand for their name.
- recognise their name and familiar logos.
- think about words that rhyme and the beginning letter sound.
- continue with our Read Write Inc sounds.
- use some of their letter knowledge in their play writing.
- write some letters from their name (preschoolers)

Understanding the World

The children will have opportunities to:

- develop their understanding of the changes in the seasons.
- talk about things they have observed in the natural world.
- think about how we care for living things.
- use simple ICT equipment such as the I Pad.
- notice differences between people.
- know that there are different countries in the world and talk about the differences they have experienced or see in photos.
- learn our Christian ethos and other religions and cultures.

Expressive Arts and Design

The children will have opportunities to:

- join in with familiar/favourite and topic related songs.
- engage in creative activities using, paints, gloop, dough, glue.
- engage in imaginative role play in our harbor, travel agent and train station.
- engage in imaginative play with our small world activities.
- explore colour, mixing colours and learn about the textures.
- mark make and draw with a variety of materials.
- play instruments with increasing control.
